## I OPPOSE [HB 3235]...Who wrote the Text of [HB 3235]? Identify the "authors."

The Text of [HB 3235] states,

"...(6) An eligible nonresident individual shall be allowed the credit computed in the same manner and subject to the same eligibility requirements as the credit allowed a resident by subsection (1) of this section. However, the credit shall be prorated using the proportion provided in ORS 316.117." **Let's take a look at this jewel.**
