Not only does this directly benefit those individuals, but truly our whole community thrives when we all have secure access to food. Kids with full bellies do better in school, the health of families would improve, and our economy would benefit from these improved odds. This will be true in every corner of Oregon– in rural, urban, and suburban communities alike. When all of our neighbors are getting the food that they need, all of Oregon thrives. This is a wonderful community-driven solution to a huge problem facing so many of our families today, and I urge you to vote yes on SB 610.
