Important points:

Our employer does not educate our managers in existing legislation.

It is essential to give OHA more resources to educate and oversee hospitals out of compliance. WE MUST ATTRACT MORE NURSES TO HEALTHCARE! Not scare them away with impossible work loads. This is a very real problem.
