By eliminating the use of ratepayer dollars for line extensions, the legislature is making it harder for natural gas to remain affordable and dependable for many Oregonians - including our most vulnerable communities throughout the state - and displaces hundreds of good quality careers that depend on the industry for jobs.

Lastly, the bill delegates very broad powers to the PUC to do whatever it is they must do to reach climate targets. The PUC is able to do the more robust work needed to properly investigate, justify and implement energy planning proposals. Their role is already well-defined and they do not need anymore powers than they already have to reach out climate goals for our great State of Oregon.
