We are a family owned business and employ up to 200 Oregonians in the Summer. We are a Moving and Freight company that rely solely on Diesel trucks to make a living. The cost of acquiring new Battery powered (Compliant) trucks is beyond cost prohibitive. They range between \$400k - \$1.2 Million dollars a piece. The Grant programs in place are but a drop in the pool when considering you have to replace 50-60 trucks. I would imagine that the party that proposes this measure has some sort of case study showing the environmental impact or carbon footprint of mining for cobalt and lithium for battery powered vs traditional diesel manufacturing of fleet trucks. The overall goal to reduce emissions has already been a slapstick effort via mandating that newer Diesel trucks have a Diesel Exhaust Fluid system installed to "Combat" the emissions of diesel. From an engineering standpoint, this has been a joke all across the spectrum. Using ammonia/Urea and super heating the diesel exhaust to reduce emissions has been a monumental foley that has already increased the cost of doing business exponentially.
