They deserve to have staff that are able to talk with them while they are providing care, not people that are racing to complete tasks. Some patients require repositioning that they are unable to do on their own, all patients require hygiene to be healthy, these are some of the first things that get neglected when there is insufficient staffing.

To provide the best, safest care please ensure that safe staffing ratios are made law, you never know when you are someone you care about may need them.
