A stable food supply and robust supply chain is critical to national and state security. This is a formula for disaster.

SB 85 is a threat to our economic and food security in perilous times. It is a solution (posing as a study) that is looking for a problem (while assuming there is one). It will only drive recession, scarcity, inflation, and higher food costs. Say NO to SB 85. There is NO upside.
