Thank you Chair Dembrow and members of the committee.

My name is John Bateman and I am a Junior at West Salem High School. I am here representing Our Future, a student statewide network focused on environmental action, speaking in support of SB-854, which would require place based climate education for grades K-12.

The climate education that I have received in my 12 years of school has been broad and unspecific. The surface level information that I've been given, by curriculum limited to science classes, doesn't do the climate crisis justice. I had learned enough to know that it was a problem, and that something needed to be done, but when I looked around at my school, my community, my country, and the world, it seemed like nothing truly meaningful was being done to address the issue. When my environmental club president at the time approached me about joining Our Future, I leapt on the opportunity to become involved in local climate activism.

The simple fact is that learning about climate issues inspired me to get involved to try to address those climate issues.
