Non-profits provide much-needed support and assistance to the community. During the first years of the COVID pandemic, Oregon Health Authority Public Health Division recognized the need to include nonprofits, including communitybased organizations, in providing community support when the pandemic took hold of the state. SB 606 helps to ensure that Oregon's nonprofits retain staff to continue providing essential services to Oregonians.

SB 606 provides several important needs. First, it develops a workforce retention fund to ensure nonprofits can retain their current employees in the short term. In addition, SB 606 includes the creation of a Nonprofit Task Force to explore how the state can do better in providing support to nonprofits, from payment delivery, reevaluating reporting requirements, and increasing nonprofit wages to ensure



that all employees who desire to pursue a career in nonprofit work, are able to afford to do so.

I strongly urge you to pass SB 606 to ensure that all Oregon non-profits are given their fair share and recognized for their contributions before, during, and after the COVID-19 pandemic.
