A number of years ago, I had the unpleasant experience of visiting a mega-dairy, though not in Oregon. It made a lasting impression on me and is why I am passionate about the moratorium.

Factory farms pose enormous health risks to our planet: our water, our air, our soil and to the people that work and live in these areas as well as the animals that are forced into these environments. The 11 mega-dairies here use as much water on a daily basis, for drinking and cleaning, as a small city. This is truly unsustainable! In addition to water usage and pollution, greenhouse gases such as methane and nitrous oxide not only warm the planet, but pose real health risks to those living and working in these areas.
