Dear Chair Dembrow and members of the Senate Education Committee.

I was raised in eastern Oregon, and I attended Oregon State University and received a double bachelor in Biology and Education. I have been teaching for the last five years and have been a wildland firefighter for 15 years. I live in Salem, Oregon.

My climate story is that I have been fighting fires since I was 18 years old, all across the United States of America, from the tundras of Alaska to the deserts of Arizona. I have seen firsthand the increase in the size of these fires across the US. I see the damage firsthand while on the front line protecting our wildland.
