RE: Support Statewide Ranked Choice Voting, HB 2004 House Committee on Rules

Chair Fahey, Vice Chair Breese-Iverson, Vice Chair Kropf, and members of the House Committee on Rules.

My name is Jennifer Stangel and I live in Milwaukie. I am writing to testify in strong support for HB 2004, which will establish ranked choice voting statewide and help ensure all Oregonians are represented in our democracy.

In our current elections, candidates in crowded races are consistently winning with less than a majority. Over half of statewide and federal races with more than two candidates won with narrow support in Oregon's 2020 and 2022 primaries, leaving voters feeling like their vote didn't count and unable to fully express their preferences. Fear of splitting the vote creates barriers for candidates to run and leads to voter cynicism. It's clear that our elections aren't serving voters or candidates as best as they could. Ranked choice voting is a simple improvement to our elections that will lead to more reflective elected bodies for Oregonians from every community.

I am registered as a Non-Affiliated voter so I typically do not have the opportunity to vote in the national primaries. In 2020, however, an organization made it possible for me to use RCV in the primaries and it was wonderful! Not only was I able to participate, but I was able to have my vote reflect my priorities without fear that my vote was wasted. I want all Oregonians to have that same feeling for our statewide elections. The Non-Affiliated voter section is the largest growing "party" so it's critical that we have a system that allows this block of voters the opportunity to vote and feel their vote means something.

I am not alone in my support of this bill. This legislation is supported by a coalition of over 30 organizations, including culturally-specific organizations, labor unions, environmental groups, housing advocates, rural communities, youth-empowering organizations, and good government groups.

Ranked choice voting is a proven solution and Oregon's next step as a leader in election reform. Please support HB 2004 and pass it out of committee.
