Re: <u>HB 2345</u> – Reducing days in segregated housing for adults in custody – Support

The League of Women Voters of Oregon supports the -1 amendment of HB 2345 based on our social justice position that all individuals, whether incarcerated or not, deserve a healthy and safe environment. We believe that reducing the maximum number of days an adult in custody may be in segregated housing not only benefits the mental and physical health of those directly impacted but positively impacts the wellbeing of the correctional institution as a whole.

We have no opinion as to whether 14 days should be set as the maximum length of time in segregated housing, but we urge the Department of Corrections to favor an individualistic approach and to use the best available mental health research when making that determination.

We want to take this opportunity to commend the Department of Corrections for taking positive steps since 2015 to reform Special Housing policies in partnership with Disability Rights Oregon, the Vera Institute of Justice, the Norwegian Correctional Service, and the UC San Francisco's Amend Program. We are fully behind the goals set forth in "The Oregon Way" and to any ongoing efforts to humanize the prison environment that are consistent with the 2015 United Nations Standard Minimum Rules for the Treatment of Prisoners.

We urge passage of HB 2345 and thank you for the opportunity to discuss this legislation.
