## Re: HB 5008 – Columbia River Gorge Commission Budget – SUPPORT

The League of Women Voters of Oregon have followed Columbia River Gorge issues for many years. League members have served on the Gorge Commission in the past. We have provided comments in support of the Gorge's protected status under the National Scenic Area Act. We also have strong positions on Oregon's land use planning program and in addressing climate change.

We were pleased by the adoption of an updated Management Plan that includes a Climate Action Plan and Diversity, Equity and Inclusion. We want to support the Director's request that DLCD be budgeted to provide a continuation of small planning grants for those Gorge counties.

In 2021 we supported Phase 1 of the Access Database Replacement, so we support implementation of that work by supporting POP 101, Phase 2 of this project. To complement that work and continue updated GIS data, we support an increase to full-time for the GIS manager in POP 102. These technical positions are difficult to fill as half-time so increasing to full-time will also help with any future recruiting for this important work. The Commission's success with the Vital Indicators Program should indicate the targeted work they do with limited funds—in this case, the one-time planner to lead this work.

We hope the committee will consider the packages in Washington State's budget for additional legal counsel resources, a diversity and equity initiative and a climate change related position. Certainly, this very special place needs additional attention related to the effects of climate change.

## We urge your Support for HB 5008 with the additions in the Washington State budget.
