My name is Maya Light. I am a student at the University Of Oregon, and I am here today to submit my written testimony in support of HB 3121 with the -1 Amendment that will help make critical investments in Open Oregon Educational Resources, Oregon's statewide textbook affordability program.

Growing up I never thought higher education was an opportunity for me, as I am from a low-income one-parent household.
