In support of SB 85, the factory farm moratorium bill:

I am a resident of Portland, and even though I'm not a farmer, I am passionate about this issue because I care about family farms, access to local high-quality food, sustainable agriculture, animal welfare, and the environment. Huge factory farms are a disaster for every being involved (except the few who profit from them) -- from the animals, workers, and consumers, to the neighbors and future generations who will be left to clean up the ecological mess left behind. If we care at all about Oregon, we must halt the expansion of factory farming and protect animal welfare, our environment, family farms, and frontline communities.
