Confined animal feed operations (aka CAFOs), including mega-dairies, large chicken operations and confined lifestock, have no place in Oregon's future. Let me count the ways.

- 1. CAFOs use large quantities of water, while also contributing to groundwater pollution. Having a sufficient potable water supply for the long-term is a major concern in ALL regions of Oregon. CAFOs will accelerate and exacerbate the water crisis across Oregon, to the detriment of our communities and public health.
- 2. CAFOs harm small- and medium-scale family farms by consuming excessive quantities of water, monopolizing farm-adjacent operations such as packaging, and polluting the surrounding area.
- 3. They reduce local property values by degrading livability in the community. They smell bad, they pollute the water, they degrade the land and they create traffic congestion.
- 4. They are low-quality employers, seeking to pay the lowest possible wage with minimal worker safety, in order to maximize corporate profit. Our family farmers are far better employers for their communities.
- 5. CAFOs are counter to Oregon's climate action goals due to their high greenhouse gas emissions, resource demands and transportation demands.

Please advance SB 85 as a vote that favors small- and medium-scale family farms over corporate interests. Our family farms have the interests of Oregon's working families and natural resources at their hearts; CAFOs do not.
