My name is Leah Benson. I'm a small business owner and consultant who is a proud resident of Portland who and I am writing to express my in strong support for HB 2004. I firmly believe that Ranked Choice Voting (RCV) can diversity our candidate pool and enfranchise more voters and I hope you will heed the voice of the people (have you heard that 73% of voters prefer RCV?) and support this bill.

In our current elections, candidates in crowded races are consistently winning with less than a majority. Over half of statewide and federal races with more than two candidates won with narrow support in Oregon's 2020 and 2022 primaries, leaving voters feeling like their vote didn't count and unable to fully express their preferences.
