As our legislators can attest, Oregon's current "first past the post" system of voting drives voters to two polar parties, predictably resulting in the type of uncompromising opposition that now impedes our government. While the current system may seem to benefit the prominent parties, those parties are deeply hamstrung by the need to keep their platforms broad and symbolic. Ranked choice voting will give voters additional choice at the polls, while enabling parties to craft clear, decisive platforms. It does not favor one party or another.
