Chair Sollman, Vice-Chair Findley and members of the Committee, my name is Max Merrill. I am a retired attorney living in Bend, Oregon.

I support SB 868, 869, 870 and 871 because, having lived in Bend for the past 52 years, I am so aware of what the explosive growth that has occurred in our community is having on our limited resources of water, clean air, and need for climate friendly buildings. We have a large houseless population and our local governments are having little success in battling this crisis.

Current building standards are simply unsustainable in the long run if we are to make any progress toward curbing climate change. Deschutes County is in a severed drought with no end in sight. Water tables are dropping and tension is growing among the competing users.

Housing costs have skyrocketed in the past 5 years and have almost completely eliminated the ability of lower and middle income citizens to be able to afford decent housing.

It is time now to act to take action to reduce building emissions which are the 2d largest source of carbon emissions in Oregon. We need to do whatever we can to promote non polluting sources of heat and power in our existing homes and all of those which are yet to be built.
