Facilities are losing their staff because they don't pay their staff enough. Period. I have seen my friends and colleagues regularly work 16+ hour shifts, 60+ hours/week as facility staff, just to have enough to provide for their families. If this bill passes, even more people will leave the profession. I've been a CNA in the skilled nursing field for the past 18 months and I plan to attend nursing school. I loved the last facility I worked at; I loved my residents, coworkers, and management. My one-year raise was \$0.54 and that was more than most of my coworkers. The cost of living in Portland is rising much faster than an extra \$0.54 an hour. That's why I quit and started working for an agency full time. Now I can afford my bills and save up for nursing school. But if this bill passes, I will probably abandon healthcare and pursue a different career. Why would I enter a profession that comes with a pre-set salary cap? Hospitals and nursing homes will always underpay us and agencies will always pay more. Profit is their priority.
