Not everyone has the income to do the things we did, but everyone deserves to live in safety and comfort, and policies you pass can make that happen.

Homes and buildings are our first line of defense against climate harms, like extreme heat and wildfire smoke and the second largest source of climate pollution in Oregon. We'll gain better health, lower costs, and a safer climate by increasing climate resilience, with more insulation and sturdier windows and doors, and transitioning to clean electricity for heating and cooking.

Let's take action in Oregon so all our homes and buildings are more resilient to protect us from climate harms. Let's make sure new construction is built smart from the start and remove barriers for Oregonians who want to improve current homes and buildings to waste less energy, protect us from climate extremes, and run on clean energy. We must prioritize helping those most harmed by climate extremes and fossil fuels.
