I've been a volunteer with Planned Parenthood Advocates of Oregon for six years. Now with the increased demand from patients who live in states with extreme bans, these barriers are more and more pronounced. We need ways to combat these barriers and increase access for everyone who needs care, and that's what HB 2002 aims to do.
