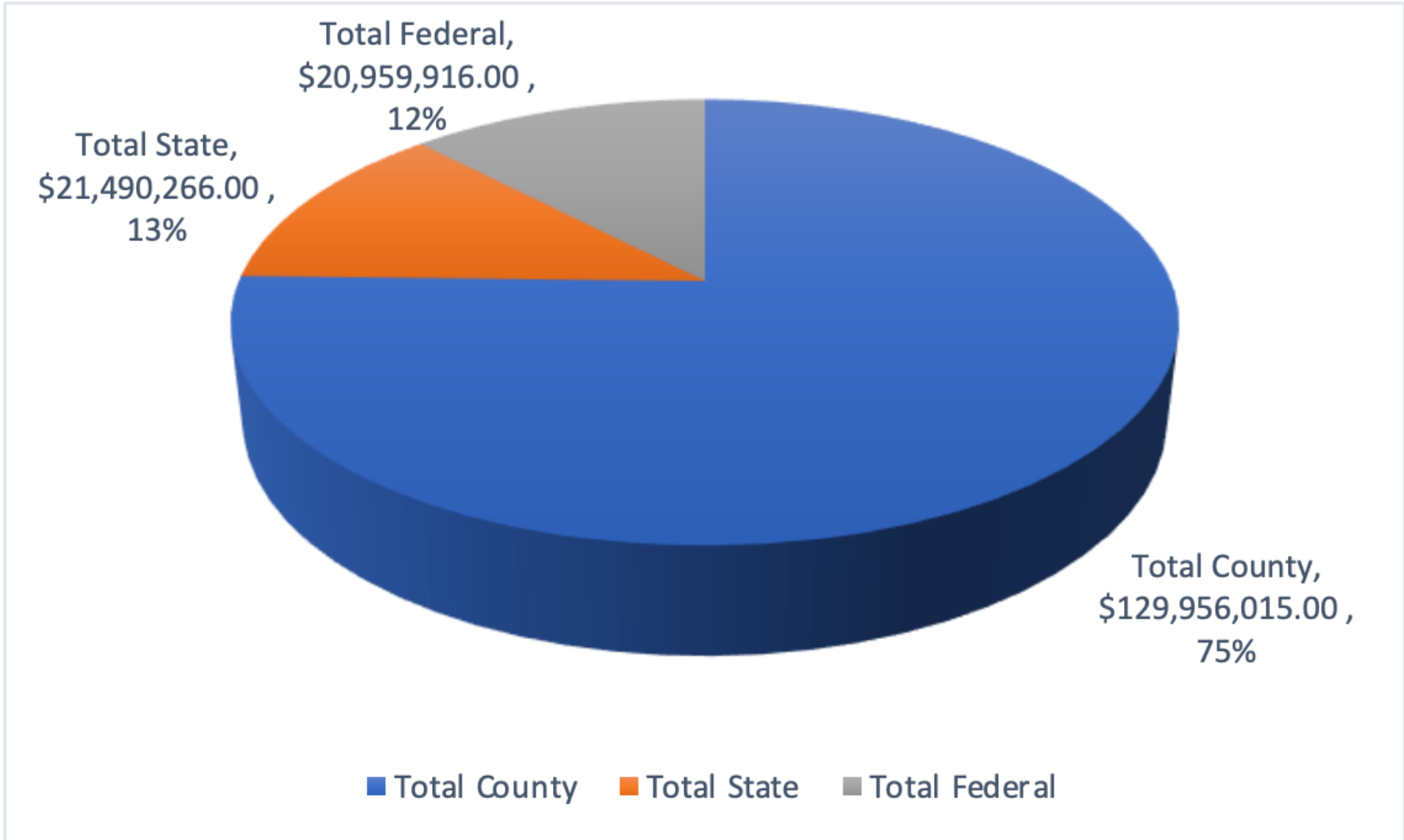



District Attorney Funding

- Historically, the State funded a significant share of the costs of District Attorney Offices
 - In 1975 the State covered 19% of the total DA costs with the remainder being paid for by the Counties. The State provided funding for elected DA salaries, a portion of the DDA salaries, and witness fees.
 - By 2000 State funding for DA Offices had dropped to 9%. In 2001 the State eliminated financial support for witness fees and in 2005 the State also eliminated financial support for DDA salaries.
 - The 2007-09 budget restored \$444,392 for DDA salary support, but this support was eliminated in the biennium 2009-11 budget.
 - Since 2011, apart from some limited grant funding, the Counties have had the sole responsibility of funding 100% of Deputy District Attorney salaries.
 - Today, the State covers elected DA compensation and benefits

District Attorneys

- Based on legislative history research, since 2003, District Attorneys have been paid based on a two-tier annual compensation plan (not in statute):
 - Tier 1 includes counties with populations exceeding 100,000
 - Tier 2 includes counties with populations less than 100,000

HB 2308

SECTION 1. ORS 8.852 is amended to read: 8.852. The district attorneys of the various counties shall be paid monthly salaries as adopted in the salary plan provided for in ORS 240.240 (2), to include salary adjustments awarded management service employees.

The salary plan must provide for each district attorney in this state to be paid the same salary.
