Re: HB 2005 "undetectable guns" – please support & improve

Dear Chair Kropf, Vice Chairs Andersen and Wallan, and members of the Committee:

I'm a gun owner who completed an NRA hunter safety course as a teenager. I competed on a rifle team in college. I'm a Vietnam veteran, a retired Navy officer, and served five terms as Benton County's District Attorney.

I support HB 2005 to ban ghost and unserialized guns. Here's why:

- Ghost guns defeat security screenings at sensitive locations like courthouses, airports, and the Capitol. Justice Clarence Thomas, in his majority opinion last year in the Bruen case, wrote that courts can use analogies to "longstanding laws" protecting "sensitive places such as schools or government buildings."
- <u>Unserialized guns are the tools of criminals</u>. If HB 2005 doesn't pass, we've effectively legalized the removal of serial numbers. Doing so will only make it easier for ex-felons, domestic abusers, and gang members to avoid legal consequences for their violent acts.

There needs to be a carrot as well as a stick to get undetectable guns out of circulation. Please consider including a grace period for voluntary turn-in and buyback. Otherwise people who legally possess untraceable firearms today will have no way or incentive to get rid of them without risking arrest.
