The black market would also increase criminal activity in our state, as people turn to illegal activities to obtain vaping products. As a responsible business owner, I have always enforced strict age verification policies and taken steps to prevent minors from accessing my products. Flavors play an essential role in helping smokers transition to a less harmful alternative, and many have reported that they were only able to quit smoking cigarettes because of flavored vaping products. A ban on flavors would deny adult smokers access to a proven harm reduction tool that has helped many quit smoking.

In conclusion, I urge the lawmakers to reject HB3090 and consider its detrimental impact on small businesses, tax revenue, and public health. The vaping industry, if regulated properly, can provide jobs and significant tax revenue for the state but prohibition is not the way, we need to find a better way.
