Members of the House Judiciary Committee,

As a mom, social worker, and life-long Oregonian who has lost 5 loved ones to gun violence (all in Oregon), I am writing to urge your support of HB 2007. We are living through a perilous time, with political violence and gun violence causing a great deal of division and fear in the United States. Every day, 120 Americans are killed with guns and more than 200 are shot and wounded (www.everytownresarch.org). Shamefully, guns are the leading cause of death for American children and teens (https://www.nichd.nih.gov/about/org/od/directors_corner/prev_updates/gun-violence-July2022).

It's estimated that there are 446 million firearms in the US, meaning that for every 100 citizens there are 120 firearms (https://americangunfacts.com/gun-ownership-statistics/).

Local governments know their communities best. They know the undercurrents of local discord and possible unrest. They should have the ability to keep guns out of sensitive areas rather than being required by the state to allow guns. As we've learned from watching American political unrest recently, government buildings and courthouses are often targets for violence. For the sake of public safety, as well as to protect American democracy, guns should be prohibited in these areas, even for concealed carry permit holders.
