Regarding: OPPOSITION to HB2005

On behalf of OSSA, Oregon Citizens, and Hunters, I would like to testify **AGAINST** HB2005.

- HB2005 makes the possession of previously legal firearms now illegal, with no provision for transition. This is an injustice and unconstitutional attack on Oregonians.
- HB2005 redefines requirements for frame and receivers that conflict from the current federal ATF standards. HB2005 also is in direct conflict with commercial product standards. Which should Oregonians follow?
- Federal law already effectively addresses unfinished frames and undetectable firearms. When HB2005 does not just repeat the federal law, it directly conflicts and builds a web of inconsistent requirements which will prevent lawful constitutional firearms ownership.

HB2005 does not reduce crime! HB2005 does, however, infringe on law abiding citizens.

There is no evidence, or logic, that supports that HB2005 additional requirements would ever be followed by existing or would be criminals. A criminal would never consider building their own as it is time consuming, requires specialize tools, and is much more costly. Undetectable firearms confiscated are overwhelmingly those with serial numbers removed aid in black market sales. KGW8 investigative reports surveyed where the guns criminals use come from. In 2021, for over 1000 guns confiscated, the key sources were stolen, illegal purchase for others, and illegal black market.

Oregonians, you are being used! Do Not Stand for It!

The source of HB2005 is not a secret. HB2005 was crafted by groups outside Oregon and handed to our legislature to pass. This is direct example of the national groups using Oregon citizens as pawns to test and further their agenda to infringe upon lawful firearms ownership.

Drive for Real Solutions!

OSSA recommends we steer our effort to confront the drivers and root causes of violent crime in our community. In our view, these are: Addiction, Mental Health, Lack of Law Enforcement Community Engagement, Not enforcing current laws, and Mental illness – Suicide Prevention. (link)
