

Statement for the Record House Behavioral Health and HealthCare Committee March 22, 2023

HB 2397 Bulk Purchasing of Opioid Reversal Medications

Chair Nosse, Vice Chairs Nelson and Goodwin and members of the committee, please accept this statement for the record on behalf of Dr. Alex Skog, the President of the Oregon Chapter of the American College of Emergency Physicians. OR-ACEP is a medical society that has represented physicians specializing in emergency medicine since 1971 and its members share a commitment to improve emergency healthcare for all Oregonians.

OR-ACEP supports HB 2397 with amendments and would like to thank Rep. Dexter for convening the Opioid Harm Reduction Coalition to develop strategies to address the epidemic. This bill addresses the key components to attack the opioid epidemic head-on with the critical element of establishing funding to put opioid antagonist kits directly in the hands of those who need them.

From the vantage point of treating Oregonian's every day in the emergency department, the past few years have demonstrated a complete transformation of the opioid epidemic. No longer are people overdosing on opioids prescribed by medical providers but they are all too frequently unknowingly taking pills that they think are prescription medications and being poisoned by laboratory derived synthetic opioids such as fentanyl and an ever-growing list of even more powerful opioid derivatives. From the straight-A teenager I took care of who thought the Xanax he took at a party would be the same pill as his family member was prescribed to the father taking what he thought was oxycodone from a friend for a back injury, I see Oregonians regularly poisoned by supercharged synthetic opioids thought to be prescription medication.

This bill pivots our efforts to attack today's epidemic head-on by addressing this new reality. Short acting opioid antagonists, like naloxone, have been shown to be incredibly safe and effective in reversing opioid poisoning. It can save lives immediately and here's how:

First, it will get naloxone into the community where the poisonings are happening. Naloxone must be omnipresent to be able to be administered to victims in the minutes between the first signs of an opioid poisoning developing and the rapid progression of the poisoning to death.

Second, this package provides the vital funding to place naloxone in the hands of Oregonians at risk. A single naloxone kit costs \$127 at the pharmacy down the street from my emergency department. Naloxone prescriptions are worthless for my uninsured patients at this price. This legislation allows for me to put naloxone kits directly in the hands of my patients.

We urge you to pass HB 2397.
