Dear Chair Kropf, Vice Chairs Anderson and Wallan, and members of the Committee,

I write on behalf of the Bend City Council to express our strong support for the package of common-sense gun safety measures being considered by the House Judiciary Committee. We support the passage of HB2005, HB2006, HB2007 because these bills will promote safety in our communities and in our public places.

Like too many communities across Oregon, Bend is no stranger to gun violence. In August of 2022, our community suffered the trauma and horror of a 20-year-old man with a rifle and a shotgun walking into a grocery store, firing hundreds of rounds, killing two innocent victims, and ultimately taking his own life. The rate of gun suicides in Bend and Deschutes County is growing at an alarming rate; a 2020-report showed that youth suicides have doubled in the last two decades, with the majority of youth suicide occurring by gun.

Banning 3D-printed guns and raising the minimum age to buy a gun are reasonable changes to our laws and will save lives. We also firmly believe that our public City buildings should be safe and welcoming for everyone, and that local communities, through their local leaders, should be allowed to choose whether to keep all guns out of public buildings.

We urge the Committee to move these three bills forward with a do-pass recommendation.
