People will only flourish with economic equality, and stability. When you are always struggling to make it paycheck to paycheck just for survival, it can be such a burden on your mental health. Often times it is not easy to see how deeply a person can be affected by being so limited, or how those stresses can reach so many aspects of ones livelihood. Or even more importantly how the lack of economic equity can roll right into generational poverty. Having acses to the proper resources and opportunities for growth could be literally saving lives, and it is a chance to add value to our people in ways that will in turn add value to all of our communities and that will benefit, our county and our state. Recognizing the ties between economic justice and behavioral health is paramount in creating a solution here, and this is why it is so important to me that we have your support on HB 3431.
