Ranked choice voting is a civil and logical voting method, and is and being adopted in jurisdictions around the nation and the world.

With ranked choice voting candidates will need to reach a broader range of voters (as they need to attract both first and second-choice votes) and thus are more incentivized to focusing on issues, not mud-slinging their opponent(s).
