This law is one that has the unfortunate nature of attempting to resolve a problem by attacking those who are not a problem. Oregon is a state with many legal gun owners who use firearms for recreation, provision of sustenance, protection of livestock and both personal and property protection. Rural people often see firearms as tools that are used frequently and safely, while sportsmen must commit to safe usage and pass testing to make sure they understand such usage. The purpose of this law is not really to make Oregon a safer place, but to be used as a method for one political party to gain power over another. In addition to those already mentioned among other groups, a law such as this would drive a deeper wedge between Law Makers in Salem and our rural communities, sportsmen and legal gun users than already exists.
