Testimony of WaterWatch of Oregon

Founded in 1985, WaterWatch is a non-profit river conservation group dedicated to the protection and restoration of natural flows in Oregon's rivers. We work to ensure that enough water is protected in Oregon's rivers and aquifers to sustain fish, wildlife, recreation, and other public uses of Oregon's waters. We also work for balanced water laws and policies. WaterWatch has members across Oregon who care deeply about our rivers, their inhabitants and the effects of water laws and policies on these resources.

WaterWatch supports HB 2929 -2

What HB 2929 does: HB 2929-2 would authorize the Water Resources Department to seek temporary or permanent injunctive relief to address known illegal uses of water, including using water without a permit or continuing use after a watermaster has regulated a water right off.

<u>WaterWatch urges support for HB 2929-2:</u> Illegal water use is something that hurts everyone, whether a farmer, city or fish. Currently, the Department's regulatory toolbox to address illegal water use is not nimble enough to expeditiously address illegal use by those who refuse to comply with the Department's efforts to regulate them off.

HB 2929-2 would grant the Department the ability to seek injunctive relief in those rare cases that a person who is illegally using water refuses to comply with the Department's initial attempts to shut off their illegal use. This authority to seek injunctive relief would rest only with the Department, not third parties.

Rivers, streams and aquifers across the state are overallocated, meaning more water rights have been granted than nature can fulfill. Climate change is making existing water scarcity problems worse. A recent Secretary of State Report on water highlights the need to work towards water equity and security, including a specific directive to support the regulatory efforts of state agencies. This bill offers the legislature an opportunity to do something to heed that call.

We urge the Committee to support HB 2929-2.
