We spend about \$6000 per year on hair and supplies, all of that going into the Oregon economy, and my spending is just a drop in the bucket. In my case, I use deer tails that are from meat processors, the tails being left over from legal hunting kills. I believe in God's plan of honoring an animal killed for food by utilizing all if it. Restricting hide and hair sales would mean this type of animal product would go to waste which would be a disgrace to the animal and to mankind as well.
