Prohibiting the sale of animal fur has unintended consequences for the fly fishing communities which rely on animal fur for fly tying and the acquisition of flies for the purposes of fly fishing. I believe this house measure was created with the right animal rights protections in mind, however there are ancillary implications to a major recreational activity the way the bill is currently written.
