Unfortunately it comes as no surprise to hear that an amendment has come in at the last minute for SB 348. It should be abundantly apparent why trust in our government is so low.

SB 348 will do nothing to prevent criminals from using firearms for ill intentions, it will only serve to punish and suppress the law abiding citizen.
