**Re: HB 2199 (2023)**

To Chair Nathanson and Committee Members:

The City of Medford fully supports extension of all Enterprise and E-Commerce Zones that are set to expire in 2025. Extension of these economic incentives will continue to provide Medford, and other jurisdictions with the ability to attract and retain businesses that are vital to our economy.

The Medford zone has had over 90 approved applications which has created or retained 6,031 jobs with nearly \$250 million in investments since 1998. These totals are also highlighted with Grants Pass, Rogue (Josephine County) and Jackson County as follows:
