I am writing in opposition to HB3390. This bill would limit the sale of fur in the state as noted in the bill. This is a case of government over-reach attempting to codify the morality of using fur as clothing, jewelry, etc. This is done under the guise of prevention of cruelty but excludes cows, deer, taxidermy, etc. One wonders if the authors felt that cows and sheep are less deserving of protection than "cute" animals like mink, otter, seal, wolf and rabbit.
