The 64 page amendment to this bill was added at 7pm on Friday night. Most people won't hear about it in time to make it to the hearing in Salem at 5 on Monday. Many people won't hear about it in time to testify publicly and voice their opposition.

The proposal in the bill to increase the 'permit-to-purchase' fee from \$65 to \$150 hurts law abiding citizens, especially low-income earners. Why do you want to make it harder for low-income earners, who are at higher risk of violence, to defend themselves? A permit to purchase at all is unconstitutional, anyway.

Backdating the prohibition against gun magazines holding more than 10 rounds to December criminalizes the buyers of such magazines despite it being legal at the time due to do so. How is it fair to punish people for retrospective crimes?

Increasing the minimum age to buy a gun to 21 is unconstitutional.

Requiring a 72-hour waiting period between the purchase time and the delivery to the buyer is unconstitutional.
