Certification/Recertification by the National Commission on the Certification of Physician Assistants

(CME, testing, additional qualification certifications)

OMB Investigatory authority on reports from the public and colleagues regarding performance, professional behavior and competence.

I am a retried Physician Assistant with 40 years of practice in Oregon. I was Oregon Society of Physician Assistant legislative Co-Chair during the 1989 session led to the PA Masters Degree Program at Oregon Health Sciences University.
