Dear Members of the Joint Ways and Means Committee,

My name is Julie Hastings and I live in Portland.

I urge you to renew Oregon's \$15 million Community Violence Intervention fund, administered by DOJ's Crime Victim and Survivor Services Division, in the budget.

Last year, Oregon appropriated \$15 million to these services for the very first time, and we know there is already more demand than funding available. Funding is set to expire in 2024. If we want to reduce gun violence over the long term, we can't make a one-time investment; we have to make a sustained commitment to strategies we know work to reduce violence.

Grants support evidence-informed programs across the state of Oregon that address many different types of gun violence, from street-based outreach to reduce homicides in Multnomah County to veteran suicide prevention programs in Eastern and Southern Oregon.

In late December 2022, my brother-in-law was shot and killed. No one should have to suffer the pain that my family has endured since his senseless murder. I applaud Oregon's commitment to reducing fun violence, but it shouldn't end after just one year.

Thank you for supporting these live-saving programs in the state budget.
