Honorable members of the Ways and Means committee. I am advocating for additional funding for M110 and respect for Oregon voters actions on November 3, 2021. M110 directly impacts the quality of life for every Oregonian. The language used in dialogue about this measure, just like it's funding deserves to be expanded. M110 allows Oregon communities and it's voters to address a broad spectrum of life when articulated appropriately. This Measure is holistically impacting Public Safety, Human Services, and Health, while broadly addressing the issues of refunding, not defunding the Police or law enforcement.
