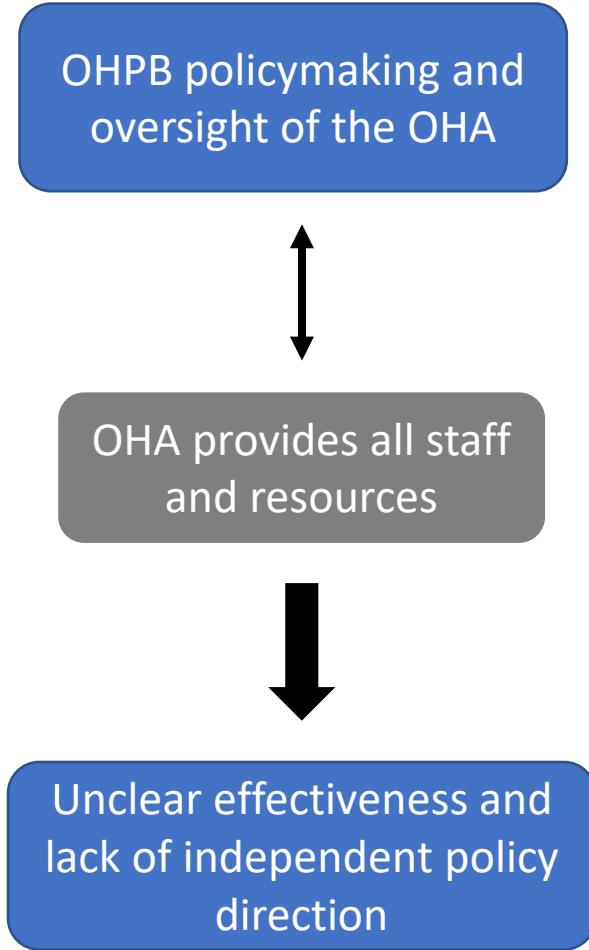
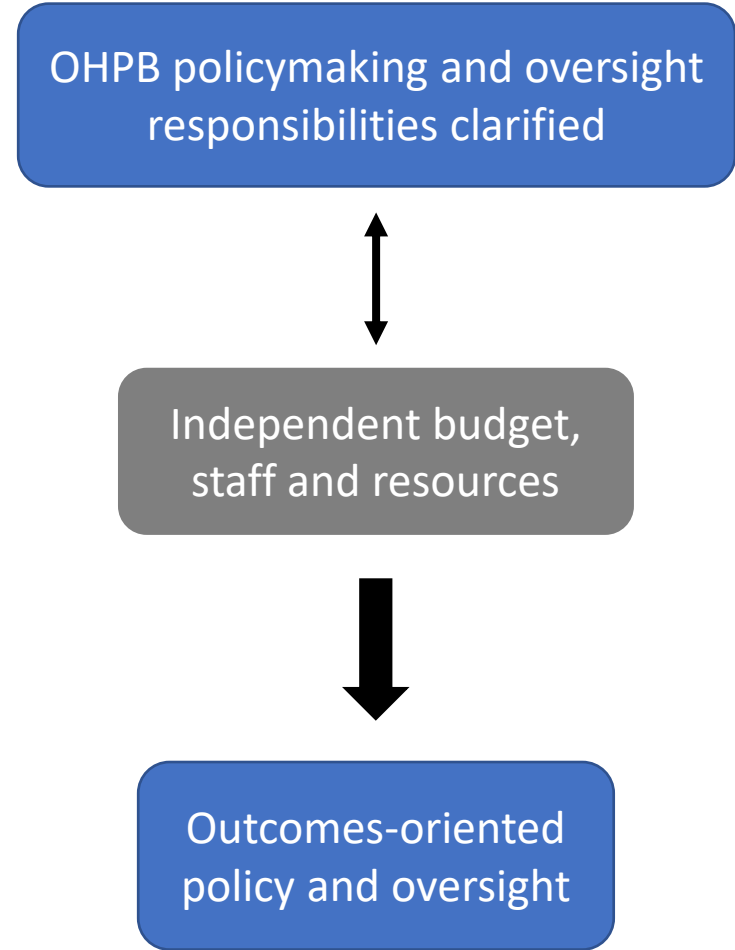

Oregon Health Policy Board

What is the Board responsible for?

Statutory policymaking and oversight body for the Oregon Health Authority (ORS 413.011)

- Develop plan for the Legislative Assembly to provide and fund health care access.
- Develop program to provide health insurance premium assistance.
- Publish health outcome and quality measure data.
- Establish evidence-based clinical standards and practice guidelines used by providers.
- Approve and monitor community-based health initiatives with regular reporting to Legislative Assembly.
- Establish cost containment mechanisms.
- Ensure that health care workforce is sufficient in number and training to meet demand.
- Work with congressional delegation to advance Oregon's health reforms.
- Establish a basic health benefit package for health insurance exchange plans.
- Investigate and report annually to the Legislative Assembly on future changes to the health insurance market in Oregon.
- Meet cost containment goals by structuring reimbursement rates that reward comprehensive management of diseases, quality outcomes, and efficient use of resources.
- Oversee expenditures from the Health Care Provider Incentive Fund.


Oregon Health Policy Board

What can the Board do?

- Reorganize the OHA as it considers necessary to properly conduct the work of the authority, subject to the approval of the Governor.
- Submit legislative proposals to Legislative Counsel to provide statutory authorization to carry out any of the board's duties or implement its recommendations.
- Adopt rules necessary for the administration of the laws that the board is charged with administering.
- Establish advisory and technical committees when necessary to aid and advise in the performance of the board's functions.
