Thank you for the opportunity to submit testimony on the Oregon Conservation Corps Funding Opportunities. On behalf of the cities and counties in Central Oregon, the Central Oregon Intergovernmental Council is in **support** of House Bill 5025 – Higher Education Coordinating Commission – Workforce Investment Related Programs and Funding.

Senate Bill 762 established the Oregon Conservation Corps and the Oregon Conservation

Council to partner with the Heart of Oregon Corps to create the Central Oregon Wildfire

Workforce Partnership. Youth crews, comprised of local at risk youth, conduct fuels

reduction work on private and public property within Jefferson, Deschutes, and Crook Counties. This work is free of charge for property owners and is prioritized for underserved
