1: Senate Bill 962 (2019) Requirements

In the 2019 Regular Legislative Session, the legislature passed Senate Bill (SB) 962¹. This bill clarified the processing of U Visa Certification Requests in Oregon. The U Visa is a nonimmigrant status for victims who are helpful to law enforcement or government officials in the investigation or prosecution of criminal activity². An early step in applying for a U Visa is submitting a certification request to a certifying agency³ to certify that the applicant was/is helpful in the prosecution of the crime. Section 2 of SB 962 requires law enforcement agencies to submit data to the Oregon Criminal Justice Commission (CJC) on U Visa certification requests in Oregon that the CJC will then report on to the legislature. This report covers the first year of this data collection, including certification requests received by certifying agencies in Oregon during 2020.

SB 962 (2019) specifies the data law enforcement agencies shall submit to the CJC. Specifically, all certifying agencies that received certification requests shall submit the total number of certification requests received; of those requests, agencies shall report the number granted, denied, and pending as of the date of submission. For denied certification requests, certifying agencies report the number of times each of the following were the reason for the denial: (i) Lack of qualifying criminal activity; (ii) Lack of helpfulness; (iii) Lack of jurisdiction over certification request; (iv) Other circumstances for which a certifying official or agency may lawfully deny certification. According to SB 962, section 2, subsection 3(a), the CJC shall identify any certifying agency that did not submit a report as required. To fulfill this requirement, CJC asked all certifying agencies in the state to submit data, whether they received certification requests or not.

2: 2020 Certification Requests in Oregon

The first year of data covers certification requests received by agencies in 2020. Table 2.1. displays the reported data on 2020 certification requests stratified by type of agency. CJC received data from 125 certifying agencies in the state: Oregon Judicial Department⁴, 28 District Attorney's Offices, and 96 Law Enforcement Agencies. Of the 125 agencies, 72, or 58 percent, reported that they received no certification requests in 2020. Most of the reported certification requests were approved. District Attorney's offices reported the most requests, 273, and reported the greatest percent approved, 82 percent.

Table 2.2. displays the denial reasons for certification requests reported to the CJC in 2020. The most common denial reason reported by District Attorney's Offices and the Oregon Judicial Department is Lack of qualifying criminal activity. However, for law enforcement agencies, the most common denial reason is lack of jurisdiction. In some counties the District Attorneys' Offices process certification requests instead of law enforcement agencies. In these counties, law enforcement agencies that receive requests, as policy, forward the requests directly to their county's District Attorney's office, essentially denying the request due to lack of jurisdiction. Tables A.1., A.2., and A.3. in the appendix display the detailed certification requests received.

3: Data Not Reported

2021 is the first year in which data was collected. The data submission window was extended several times to allow time for certifying agencies to submit data. The official submission window closed on September 10, 2021. At that time CJC began following up with agencies who had submitted incomplete or inconsistent data. CJC heard back from the final agency in early October. SB 962 (2019) sunsets in

2023, so CJC will collect data in 2022 covering 2021 certification requests and submit a second report to the legislature in January 2023.

Table A.3. in the Appendix displays the District Attorney's Offices and Law Enforcement Agencies that the CJC did not receive data from. According to SB 962, section 2, subsection 3(a) this report must identify any certifying agency that did not submit a report as required. CJC directly contacted the agencies listed in Table A.3. and were unable to confirm whether these agencies received zero or more certification requests. Table A.3. does not list other agencies that have responsibility for the detection, investigation, or prosecution of a qualifying criminal activity, including but not limited to a certifying agency as defined in 8 C.F.R. 214.14. Certifying agencies that fall into this category would have been required to report to the CJC if they received certification requests in 2020.
