# **Key Takeaways of this Written Testimony**

- My first request: **be excellent to each other.** While passions may become engaged as the session continues, I ask that, after business has concluded for the day, maybe take each other out for a friendly cup of coffee or ice cream.
- My second request: don't cut the higher education budget.
  - I have written an open letter requesting an additional \$500 million dollars for the Public University Support Fund (PUSF), for a total appropriation of \$1.43 billion dollars.
  - This open letter has been co-signed by hundreds of people.
  - This \$500 million dollar number reflects the ballpark amount needed to freeze tuition increases while allowing employee salaries to keep up with the cost of living at all the public universities.
  - As I've learned more, I have also come to recognize that \$500 million may be more aspirational than realistic.
  - If an additional \$500 million for the PUSF isn't feasible then I ask the committee to seriously consider the numbers proposed by the Oregon Council of University Presidents instead: a total of \$1.05 billion for the PUSF, and other investments in students and capital projects.
  - I'm not asking for tuition-free college. I am asking for us to no longer be state #45 in the nation for per-student funding for our public universities.

## Dear Members of the Joint Ways and Means Committee,

Included on page 5 of this written testimony is an open letter. It is my pleasure to read part of it to you aloud, on behalf of the hundreds of people who have signed it, in oral testimony on Friday, April 21, 2023. I am still collecting names, and you can read the full list here, as Oregonians continue to sign on:

On these first few pages, however, I speak only for myself.

### My first ask: be excellent to each other.

Members will recall that I sent a snail-mail letter to each of you in the days after the election. It concluded with the following:

As a citizen, my top priority this upcoming legislative session is not education, nor technology, nor any other typical political issue – although all of those topics are very important to me. My top priority is a legislator's excellence to their fellow lawmakers. The strength of our democratic republic, our bedrock ebenezer which enables everything else, demands this excellence. As a younger citizen (I am in my 20s), with my future mostly in my own hands but also partly in yours, I beg this excellence.

As you work together to hash out the challenging and weighty issues before you, I continue to beg that the ideal of excellence to each other remains paramount in your deliberations. Your excellence to each other is still my top priority.

I ask this excellence of you as a hypocrite. Perhaps the most recent example of my hypocrisy is when I participated in the tuition and fee advisory board meetings for the University of Oregon this year. I regret to say that I gave one dean so much grief about her tuition proposals that I felt obligated to write a formal apology letter a month or so after the fact.

I share this story about my apology to the dean to illustrate my belief that the act of deciding the wisest way to collect and spend vast amounts of money in a committee setting is difficult. Very difficult. I don't expect unanimous agreement on all things at all times. Nevertheless, I still think we can be excellent to each other, even when we staunchly disagree.

## My second ask: don't cut the higher education budget; please increase it.

It is through sitting through all the boring-yet-weighty 8:15 am tuition and university budget meetings for months on end that I came up with the \$1,433.2 million dollar request in the open letter. In my view, the universities are lowballing the legislature on the amount actually needed to stop the twin crises of unaffordable student tuition and unlivable employee compensation.

It is also my view that investments in higher education will pay just as great, if not greater, dividends to our state down the road as investments to the rainy day fund.

"An ounce of prevention is worth a pound of cure." There are all sorts of medical sayings that are analogous to public university support. Here's another analogy: The proposed cuts to higher education are harmful bloodletting to an already sick patient. We must stop the financial hemorrhaging.

"First, do no harm." Consider skipping payments to the rainy day + education stability fund (if possible) and instead increase university funding. Why? Because for every expensive crisis and problem facing our state, I can point you to an example in our university ecosystem where hardworking, smart Oregonians are thinking deeply about all sorts of problems and thoughtful solutions to these problems:

- I think of **wildfires**, and I remember a data science project done by an honors student from southern Oregon, inspired by the disasters near her hometown. Her capstone project used machine learning to predict areas for treatment by firefighters and forest workers. Or of the new center on wildfire smoke. I Imagine all the money that could be saved with 21st century digital forest management tools, powered by home-grown research from our public universities.
- I think of the **homelessness and drug addiction crisis**, and I wonder if, for many of the homeless and addicts, if access to postsecondary education and a stable financial situation upon graduation would have resulted in a situation where they were never homeless or addicted in the first place. Relatedly, I am grateful for the private philanthropy which founded UO's Ballmer Institute for Children's Behavioral Health,<sup>2</sup> which I hope will prevent burgeoning behavioral problems that are difficult to resolve in adulthood right in the bud, during childhood.

- I think of our **housing affordability crisis** and I am reminded of UO's University Senate President-elect, Dr. Gerard Sandoval, a faculty member with expertise in land use and urban design who is serving a four year term on the Governor-appointed Housing Stability Council.<sup>3</sup> I often ask myself, will I ever be able to afford my own home? Or am I destined to rent forever if I want to stay in Oregon and be a teaching faculty member? I know there are experts in our universities that can help design thoughtful policy for Oregonians.
- For my part, I think about the hundreds of students I've taught in foundational computer science classes and labs. These computer science students will grow our silicon forest, some probably in the **silicon chip industry**. And when I'm not teaching, I'm more than happy to talk your ear off about technology regulation and deregulation, and what the legislature should do about ChatGPT, internet privacy and cybersecurity, advanced scientific computing tools, and more. I nerd out to this technological policy wonk stuff! And I have done it all for ~\$1,700 a month, through COVID and record-breaking inflation. But, sadly, I know that I won't get the pay raise the University of California system just gave their graduate employees (they will earn \$10,000 / year more than I do now) unless UO raises undergraduate tuition or you vote for a bigger state appropriation to higher education.

Universities need meaningful investment to thrive. These centers and institutes don't appear from nowhere, they need money. And students need a break on tuition. Now, I'm not asking for free tuition. I'm asking for funding which will lift up Oregon from being among the bottom five states in the union for public university funding per student.

But mostly, I am asking for your excellence, even as topics start to become more charged and emotions start to run hot. I am rooting you on!

#### Dear members of the Joint Ways and Means Committee of the Oregon Legislative Assembly:

Thank you for your hard work in confronting the many challenges facing our state. It isn't easy, and we are grateful for your service in the difficult task of writing the budget.

We have concerns with Governor Kotek's proposed budget and the co-chairs' budget framework. In her proposal, the governor recommended that the increase for the state appropriation to Oregon's Public University Support Fund (PUSF) be a mere 1.4% for the next biennium. Inflation for the last biennium was ten times that, at ~14%. The co-chairs' budget framework calls for a reduction of ~\$90 million dollars from education areas outside of K-12, a decrease of -1.8%.

While there are other funding streams besides the PUSF in Gov. Kotek's budget proposal, such as additional investments for students from underrepresented backgrounds and support for community colleges, we note that all of higher education composes only 3% of Kotek's overall proposed budget. Compare Oregon's 3% state budget allocation to postsecondary education with Nevada at more than 6%, Idaho at 7%, Washington at 8%, or Utah and California at just over 10%.<sup>4</sup>

The practical result of Gov. Kotek's recommended budget for public universities or the co-chairs' budget framework, if adopted by the legislature, will be some combination of tuition and fee hikes, stagnant employee compensation against years of steep inflation, unfilled vacant positions, or entire program cuts. In light of the student debt crisis and the impact of inflation in the last biennium on the poorest paid university workers, such as undergraduate and graduate student employees, this budget is simply unacceptable.

We ask for an additional \$500 million, for a total Public University Support Fund (PUSF) appropriation of \$1,433.2 million. This is a total of 1.2% of Gov. Kotek's proposed \$116,544 million dollar expenditure budget.

We recognize this is a tough budget cycle and this is a tall ask. We submit that investing in Oregon's people through properly funding public university education will grow our economy, reduce new student debt, and make future budget cycles significantly less tough.

Every bill begins with the phrase *Be It Enacted by the People of the State of Oregon.* We are the students and student supporters of the State of Oregon, and we will enact amazing things in our state over the next few decades. We are Oregon's current and future scientists, teachers, silicon chip makers, technologists, innovators, judges, professors, business owners, job creators, politicians, artists, writers, and big dreamers. We need our state to invest in us, and to help shoulder the cost of a university education in ways that haven't been seen in a long time in our state. Please, don't let us down.
