SUBJECT: SB 340 – Organized Retail Crime

This testimony is presented in support of SB 340, which reflects the recommendations of the Oregon Organized Retail Crime Task Force.

Attorney General Ellen Rosenblum and the Oregon Department of Justice are deeply concerned about the safety of the public and retail employees as organized retail crime has increased in recent years in Oregon and our neighboring states. We are also concerned about the consumers who unwittingly buy stolen goods on the secondary market not realizing that, at least with some products, they may be putting their health at risk. And we worry about the impact to businesses and the economy. It is exactly this type of crime that makes us all feel less secure and degrades the livability of our communities.

That is why we were grateful to join the Oregon Organized Retail Crime Task Force six months ago to combine our resources in a coordinated effort to address the scourge of organized retail crime. It is the Oregon way, after all, to work collaboratively with our public and private partners to come up with practical solutions for complex problems. The statewide task force is providing greater coordination among law enforcement, prosecutors, and businesses to identify, disrupt, and hold those engaged in organized retail crime accountable.

It is also why we are here today to support the recommendations of the task force as reflected in SB 340. This bill includes important policy improvements to ensure that retailers and law enforcement have the necessary tools to detect, deter and hold accountable those who commit organized retail theft and improve employee safety.
