The Oregon Midwifery Council represents midwives in Oregon and promotes patient-centered and evidence-based maternity care for all mothers and birthing people in our state. I am asking for your support of HB 2535 A to establish a doula program and provide humane treatment of pregnant and birthing people incarcerated at Coffee Creek Correctional Facility.

The improvements provided for in HB 2535 A would provide basic support, safety, and dignity to individuals going through the challenging experience of incarceration during pregnancy, birth, and postpartum.
