RE: Support Funding for Interstate Bridge Replacement Program (HB 2098)

I am offering the following comments on behalf of the Southwest Washington Regional Transportation Council (RTC), the state's designated MPO serving the counties of Clark County (WA), and co-project sponsor to the Interstate Bridge Replacement Program. These comments are offered in support of HB 2098.

RTC, in collaboration with project sponsoring agencies to the Interstate Bridge Replacement (IBR) Program, has been actively engaged in the planning and outreach, since initiation of work authorized in in the Oregon-Washington Memorandum of Intent on Replacing the I-5 Bridge over the Columbia River (November, 2019). Replacement of this interstate bridge is the top-ranking unfunded project priority within the RTC's <u>Regional Transportation Plan for Clark</u> <u>County</u> (March 2019). The project has also been rated as the #1 regional legislative priority in the <u>Clark County Transportation Alliance Policy Statement</u> for the last 5years straight.

Washington and Oregon leaders and community groups have worked diligently to establish a framework for moving this project forward. Further, Washington state's Move Ahead Washington transportation funding act committed \$1 Billion towards bridge construction, and tolling authorization was just granted during the 2023 legislative session. Through Washington's recent funding contributions, we are pleased to witness the development of a truly bi-state funding plan. We now await enactment of Oregon's funding commitments as proposed in HB 2098.

RTC affirms this investment is a regional priority as established in numerous longterm plans, and supports the appropriation of \$1 Billion in Oregon state funds to enable construction of the IBR program. HB 2098 is a laudable investment in Oregon's infrastructure and economy, enabling a safe and multi-modal bi-state connection, and promoting resiliency and prosperity within the bi-state region for decades to come.
